PROCEDURE EXPLANATION AND RISK ACKNOWLEDGMENT

I understand that the tattoo procedure involves the insertion of ink pigments into the dermis layer of my skin using sterilised equipment and proper hygiene practices.
If appropriate aftercare is not followed infection may occur. For the first week or so it is normal for the area to be red and tender. Monitor your tattoo regularly (daily) so you can tell if any changes have occurred. The signs of infection are:

- Swelling and redness that increases around the wound.
- A severe burning and throbbing sensation round the site.
- Increased tenderness and increasingly painful to touch.

Speak to your practitioner or seek medical attention immediately if you suffer from any of the above or have any concerns regarding infection in your tattoo or if there are any signs of an allergic reaction to any of the products used.

HEALTH AND MEDICAL INFORMATION

I am not pregnant or breastfeeding at the time of this procedure. I understand that getting a tattoo while pregnant or breastfeeding can have unknown effects on the fetus or breastfeeding child. I am not under the influence of drugs or alcohol during this procedure. I understand that intoxication may impair my judgement and increase the risk of complications. I do not have any conditions, illnesses, or allergies that may hinder the tattoo process or increase the risk of complications. I have disclosed any known allergies or medical conditions to the tattoo artist. I understand the studio may refuse service if my health conditions or medical history pose risks to me or the tattoo artists.

CONSENT TO TATTOO PROCEDURE AND AFTERCARE

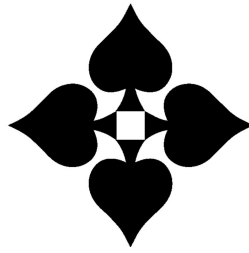
I have received satisfactory answers to all my questions regarding the tattoo procedure and aftercare. I agree with the design, placement, and size of the tattoo as discussed by the tattoo artist. I understand that the tattoo may appear different once healed, as the healing process varies from person to person. I acknowledge that the tattoo artist cannot guarantee complete colour retention or exact replication of the reference image due to variances in skin tone, texture, and other factors. I consent to the tattoo procedure and authorise the tattoo artist to perform the agreed-upon tattoo on my body. I agree to follow the provided aftercare instructions to ensure proper healing and minimise the risk of complications. Touch-ups are the sole responsibility of the tattoo artist that is assigned to your tattoo. Please note, if the artist is no longer at one of The Social Group studios, the responsibility of the touch-up falls with the artist only. The Social Group is not liable for your touch up.

WAVIER AND RELEASE LIABILITY

I acknowledge that getting a tattoo involves certain risks and potential complications beyond the control of the tattoo artist or studio. Therefore, I release, discharge, and hold harmless the tattoo artist, their assistants, and The Social Group and all studios, from any and all claims, liability, demands, actions, or causes of action arising out of or related to the tattoo procedure, including but not limited to personal injury, property damage, infection, and dissatisfaction with the final result.

AFTERCARE

Congratulations on your new tattoo!

To ensure it heals beautifully and remains vibrant for years to come, please follow these aftercare instructions carefully.

Please also bare in mind healing times vary from person to person.

Getting a new tatoo involves breaking the skin surface so there is always a potential risk for infection to occur afterwards. Your tattoo should be treated as a wound initially and it is important that thtis advice is followed so that the infection risk can be minimised.

CLING FILM

Your artist will use either second skin or cling film to dress your tattoo.

Remove the cling film once you are home.

Shower the tattoo with warm water and anti-bacterial, non-fragranced soap.

Your artist will let you know if you should re-wrap the tattoo overnight.

SECOND SKIN

Your artist will use either second skin or cling film to dress your tattoo.

Remove the second skin 2-4 days after the tattoo process.

Blood plasma or ink may have built up underneath, don't panic, this is normal.

To remove the second skin, use warm water. Sticky residue may remain, this is normal.

When washing your tattoo for the first time, pat dry using a clean hand towel or paper towel. Avoid rubbing or irritating the tattooed area.

Once your tattoo has dried, you can apply moisturiser. We recommend Palmer's - Cocoa Butter or a small amount of Coconut Oil.

Use these sparingly to avoid over moisturising.

PLEASE AVOID

Soaking, picking, or itching the tattoo. The scab that forms is normal and will fall off naturally after 5 days. Please avoid any baths, sun-beds, sunbathing, swimming or excessive sweating/exercising that may affect the healing area. Avoid wearing tight clothing to minimise rubbing and irritation to the new tattoo.

LAST BUT NOT LEAST
